**Tournament Rules & Regulations**

CATEGORY	Rules & Regulations
1) JURISDICTION	<p>A. Unless otherwise noted, the current AYSO National Rules and Regulations, Section 10 and IFAB Laws of the game will be used for this tournament. The following rules are intended specifically for this tournament only.</p> <p>B. The Tournament Committee (incl. Tournament Director, Assistant Director(s), Competition Director, Referee Administrator and other designated staff) will have jurisdiction over all games played. Disputes will be resolved by the end of the soccer day.</p> <p>C. Referee judgment calls are <b>NOT</b> subject to dispute or protest.</p>
2) FEES	<p>A. Entire fee and referee deposit must accompany tournament application and will be returned if application is not accepted. Fee must be a single check issued from the respective Region's account (no personal checks).</p> <p>B. Fees are: 10-U \$700.00 (entry fee \$500.00 plus referee deposit \$200.00),  12-U \$725.00 (entry fee \$525.00 plus referee deposit \$200.00),  14-U, \$750.00 (entry fee \$550.00 plus referee deposit \$200.00)  16-U \$775.00 (entry fee \$575.00 plus referee deposit \$200.00), and  18-U \$775.00 (entry fee \$575.00 plus referee deposit \$200.00).</p>
3) ACCEPTANCE	<p>A. Applications are accepted until March 31, 2020 online at <a href="http://cgisports.com/tournament/5808">cgisports.com/tournament/5808</a>.</p> <p>B. When applications are received more than available openings in a division, teams will be chosen based on the team rating needed to balance the pools for each division. Teams with a full referee team (three qualified referees) will also be given preference.</p> <p>C. Teams will be notified by through CGI within 48 hours of the receipt of their mailed applications and check.</p> <p>D. Teams not accepted into the tournament will be offered the opportunity to be placed on a waiting list.</p> <p>E. The primary form of communication between the Tournament and applying teams will be email and the Tournament website. Teams must designate a Team Contact on their application who has email and Internet access.</p>
4) REFUNDS	<p>A. Teams withdrawing 30 days or more before the tournament will be issued a full refund.</p> <p>B. Teams withdrawing less than 30 days before the start of the tournament will only be issued a refund if a replacement team can be found.</p> <p>C. If the tournament is canceled and cannot be rescheduled a full refund will be issued.</p> <p>D. For teams that are eligible, referee deposit refunds will be mailed no later than 14 days after the end of the tournament. Referee deposit refunds will be on a prorated basis, comparing the number of assignments actually completed versus the number that were assigned.</p>
5) RAINOUT/ CANCELLATION	<p>A. If the tournament is cancelled due to weather after partially completing and it cannot be rescheduled to be completed, refunds will be made to teams on a prorated basis, based on the number of actual games played.</p> <p>B. If the tournament cannot be held due to weather or other conditions beyond the control of the tournament hosts, then a full refund will be sent to all teams, less the cost of any pre-ordered items. Pre-ordered items will be sent to the team. Pins and pre-ordered items will be sent to the team contact person.</p>

<p><b>6) PLAYERS/TEAMS</b></p>	<p>A. Players on participating teams must be registered in AYSO and have played at least 50% of the scheduled League games in the MY2019 primary season. Regional Commissioners and coaches are responsible to ensure that all players meet eligibility requirements.</p> <p>B. The team roster must be verified and approved by each player's Regional Commissioner. Roster changes may be submitted (with the written approval of the Regional Commissioner); however, these changes must be received by the Tournament Registrar prior to the start of the tournament. There will be no roster changes allowed on tournament day after the team is officially checked-in.</p> <p>C. 3 Guest Players (players from a different region from the applying team's region) will be allowed for each team. However, the Guest Player(s) will be required to have the approval of both the Guest Player's Regional Commissioner and the Host Team Regional Commissioner (see Guest Player Form).</p> <p>D. Coed teams will be accepted; however they must play in the boy's divisions only.</p> <p>E. Division 16/18-U, will play 11-v-11, and there will be a roster limit of 18 players per team.          Division 14-U, will play 11-v-11, and there will be a roster limit of 15 players per team.          Division 12-U will play 9-v-9, and there will be a roster limit of 12 players per team.          Division 10-U will play 7-v-7, and there will be a roster limit of 10 players per team.</p> <p>F. All players must play at least half of each game. Violation of these player rules exposes a team to protest and renders them subject to forfeiture of game and possible disqualification at the discretion of the Tournament Director.</p> <p>G. Players may play up a division (except no 8-U players may participate in the tournament), but they may not play down a division. If players played up a division at the request of the region in the primary season (e.g. high school players) they should not be required to play up in the secondary season.</p>
<p><b>7) COACHES</b></p>	<p>A. Each team is limited to one Coach and one Assistant Coach only (must have one of each). These coaches must be the ones listed on the Official <b>Blue Sombrero</b> Tournament Team Roster.</p> <p>B. Each Coach must provide their AYSO Identification Number, be a currently registered volunteer, Safe-Haven certified, and AYSO trained at age-appropriate level. Proof of coach certification and training will be verified by the coach and assistant coach submitting their <b>Blue Sombrero</b> Tournament Team roster.</p> <p>C. Coaches are expected to set the example for their team in exhibiting proper AYSO behavior and <b>Kids Zone</b> behavior. Coaches are expected to remain in the technical area during games and only enter the field of play as requested by the referee.</p>
<p><b>8) REFEREES</b></p>	<p>A. Each team in the tournament will provide a crew of 3 referees. These referees may be assigned up to 3 games including stand-by, based on their qualifications. At a minimum, one of the three referees representing a team must be certified to referee games in that team's Division.</p> <p>B. All referees must be an AYSO registered volunteer for the MY2019 and be Safe-Haven Certified.</p> <p>C. Only the diagonal system of control will be used to referee the games.</p> <p>D. Referees for 14-U, 16-U, &amp; 18-U games should be Advanced level or above.          Referees for 12-U games should be Intermediate level or above.          Referees for 10-U games should be Regional or above.</p> <p>E. Youth referees are appreciated at the tournament, as long as they are not players on a team in the tournament. Youth referees will be required to have a Youth Referee Form (provided by the tournament) on them at all times while officiating at the tournament, and present to any tournament official upon request. This form must be signed by the youth referee's Referee Administrator, and be accompanied by a copy of the youth referee's Youth Volunteer Registration form.</p> <p>F. Youth referees officiating as referee of the referee team must be at least 2 years older than the age group they are refereeing.</p> <p>G. All referees must be in full uniform as defined by AYSO and USSF, including the Referee Badge. However, other uniforms pre-approved by the Tournament may be worn. The referee team must wear the same style and color of uniform. Referees not in uniform will not be permitted to referee games, and their team's referee deposit may be subject to forfeiture.</p> <p>H. If all assignments are successfully completed, the Referee Deposit will be refunded (see REFEREE PLAN for more details).</p> <p>I. Referees are expected to check in at the Referee Station at least 30 minutes prior to their assigned game. Failure to appear on time may result in a replacement referee crew being assigned to the field. Once a replacement crew has been assigned, they will have priority and the original crew must report to the Referee station for alternative assignment. Stand-by referee teams must stay at the Referee Station until they are released of their duty by the Tournament Referee Coordinator.</p>

	<p>J. Coaches and players in the tournament may not be allowed to referee.</p> <p>K. Referees will be expected to uphold the Tournament Rules and Regulations, AYSO guidelines and IFAB laws. Any failure of the referee to uphold these rules may be cause for dismissal from the tournament, and will place a team's referee deposit refund in jeopardy.</p>												
<p><b>9) FIELDS</b></p>	<p>A. All fields will be set up and taken down by the tournament staff and volunteers from the host region.</p> <p>B. Trash cans are provided at each field. Teams will be expected to clean up all trash in their area before leaving.</p> <p>C. Please observe the following Facility Use Rules while attending the tournament. <b>No Parking</b> is allowed in the alley on the south side of the Fremont Intermediate High School. <b>Kids Zone</b> will be enforced. In addition there will be no smoking, no alcoholic drinks, no animals (especially) dogs of any sizes and no bicycling on the school grounds.</p> <p>D. NO PETS ALLOWED.</p>												
<p><b>10) FORMAT</b></p>	<p>A. This is a pool-play tournament. However, when there are insufficient teams in a particular division to form pool-play, a round-robin format will be used.</p> <p>B. Each age division will be bracketed into playing pools. Each team will play a minimum of 3 played games within their respective pools. Where there are sufficient teams, divisions will also be separated into multiple competition flights.</p> <p>C. Teams will advance from qualifying pools based on pool play standings points. Number of teams advancing per pool will be determined by the number of pools in the division.</p>												
<p><b>11) CHECK-IN</b></p>	<p>A. Coaches must check in 60 minutes prior to their first game of the day at the Tournament Field Table, and must present their teams Player Registration Forms. <b>Game Cards will be provided by the tournament.</b> The players listed on the Game Cards will match the approved roster submitted with the team's application.</p> <p>B. Each coach or team representative must provide AYSO Player Registration forms with <b>original ink or printed e-signatures</b> for verification by tournament officials.</p> <p>C. Coaches must have these Player Registration forms with them at all times and ready for presentation to Tournament Officials.</p>												
<p><b>12) FIELD MONITORS</b></p>	<p>A. There will be a tournament Field Monitor assigned to each field, and will report to the Tournament Staff.</p> <p>B. At the conclusion of the game, the match referees must return the completed game cards to the Referee Table. If the match referee needs to file a misconduct report and/or incident report, he/she needs to go to the Referee Station to complete the report(s) and turns in the game cards to the Referee Administrator. Forms for misconduct and incident reports are at the Referee Station.</p> <p>C. Field Monitors will be the first to respond to any incidents or injuries, and will be in contact with the rest of the tournament staff by radio. Tournament participants are encouraged to report any concerns immediately to the Field Monitor, and also to respectfully follow any instructions given by the Field Monitor.</p>												
<p><b>13) GAMES</b></p>	<p>A. Pool play games will consist of 20 to 30 minute halves depending on the age division (see chart below) with a five minute half time. There will be a running clock during the match including substitutions. There will be no time added on for injuries or time wasted in qualifying rounds. Games will expect to end on time, and may be shortened if they started late. Pool play games may end in a tie.</p> <p>B. Championship games will be the same as pool play games with the exception that they will be played until there is a winner (see Medal Round rules below).</p> <p>C. Game duration will be dependent on the number of teams participating. 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	<p>D. The "home" team will be the first team or top team listed on the game schedule and will be responsible for providing the game ball.</p> <p>E. At Fremont Middle School, the home team will be situated on the North or East side of the field, and the visitor will be situated on the South or West side. Spectators must remain on the side of the field designated for their team. The home team will change jerseys or don overlays in the event of a color conflict with the visitor team. Overlays will be available at the check-in table with a deposit of a driver's license. If any questions, the referee will determine whether this is necessary.</p> <p>F. <b>At College Park, players and team officials will be seated on one side of the field, and spectators will be seated on the other end of the field. Team officials are defined as Coaches, Assistant Coaches, and Time-Keepers.</b></p> <p>G. There will be no warming up on the field. Teams must warm up prior to taking the field. As soon as the previous game has ended, teams must clear the field and the teams for the next game must take their places.</p> <p>H. <b>FORFEITS:</b> Teams must check in at the designated Field Station 30 minutes prior to the start of the game. There will be a five-minute grace period at the start of the game for a team to take the field before a forfeit is declared. The score for a forfeit match will be 1-0 for the remaining team (See <b>STANDINGS</b> for the points to be awarded). For U-10 division teams, there is a minimum of 5 players on the field to continue a game. For U-12 the minimum number is 6 players. For all other divisions, there must be a minimum of 7 players to continue a game. If a team cannot field the minimum number of players, the game will be abandoned and a forfeit will be declared.</p> <p>I. <b>SUSPENDED GAMES:</b> The Tournament Committee may determine to end matches early if field schedule is behind due to game delays, interference, or if weather conditions provide unsafe conditions; and may distribute awards according to games played and points. The Tournament Committee will determine the outcome of any single game which is terminated prematurely (due to inclement weather, participant injury, or interference by outside party, etc.).</p> <p>J. <b>ABANDONED GAMES:</b> if any pool play games cannot be played due to circumstances beyond the control of the tournament, the final standings of the pool will be determined by applying the Winning Percentage formula (Total Points Earned in all Game Played divided by Total Points Possible for the Number of Games Played) to each team in the pool. <b>Note.</b> This does not apply to games which were shortened due to late start. Only the Tournament Director or designee can declare a game to be abandoned or not played.</p>
<p><b>14) SUBSTITUTIONS</b></p>	<p>A. Substitutions shall be allowed approximately mid-way through each half, at halftime, and injury for ALL divisions U-10 through U-14 and will be recorded on the game cards by the referee. BU16, BU19, GU16, &amp; GU19 will have Monitored Free Substitutions that will be recorded on by each teams timekeeper.. Players must play at least half of each game.</p> <p>B. All substitutions must be approved and recognized by the referee. Substitutions may be made for injured players; however, they may not return until the beginning of the next quarter and will be considered as having played the current quarter (exception: an injured player not replaced may return to play at any time with the referee's permission).</p> <p>C. Substitutions in overtime periods of medal round matches in U10, U12, &amp; U14 will be at the beginning of the periods only.</p> <p>D. Overtimes do not require substitution of all players who are on the roster and present at the game, but only the players on the field at the end of the two overtime periods are allowed to participate in Kicks from the Penalty Mark to determine winners.</p>
<p><b>15) STANDINGS</b></p>	<p>A. Standings for pool play games will be determined on the "ten-point system" as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>WIN = 6 points</li> <li>TIE = 3 points</li> <li>LOSS = 0 points</li> <li>GOAL = 1 point (one point per goal scored up to a maximum of 3 per game, win or lose)</li> <li>SHUTOUT = 1 point (for a shutout, including a 0-0 tie)</li> <li>FORFEIT = 8 points (scored as a 1-0 win)</li> <li>RED CARD = 2 point deduction for each player, substitute, or coach send-off</li> </ul> <p>B. Winners of ties in standings will be determined as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Head to head competition</li> <li>Most number of wins</li> <li>Least number of sportsmanship point deductions (1 point per misconduct)</li> <li>Goals allowed – total (up to a maximum of five per game; fewest number advances)</li> <li>Goal differential (goals scored to three per game less total goals allowed; highest differential advances)</li> <li>Coin toss at the end of pool play.</li> </ul> <p>C. Wildcard teams will be the team(s) with the highest standings points from all teams in the division who are not automatically advancing.</p>

	D. Standings will be updated hourly at the Tournament Scoreboard/website. The deadline to challenge the posted results will be at the conclusion of Pool Play.
<b>16) ADVANCEMENTS</b>	A. Pool winners (and in some cases wildcard teams) will advance to medal round play. B. Teams will play semi-final and/or championship final matches, depending on the number of teams in each pool and the format of play for that flight.
<b>17) MEDAL-ROUNDS</b>	A. All medal round matches ending in a tie will have two full overtime periods of five minutes in length with teams changing field direction after the first five minute period. In these matches, if still tied after overtime play, the game shall be decided by IFAB kicks from the penalty mark.
<b>18) AWARDS</b>	A. Medals adhered on plaques where the coaches and players can insert their team pictures will be presented to coaches and players from the first place teams in each Division. Second, third, and fourth place teams will receive medals. B. A tournament souvenir pin will be presented to each player, coach and assistant coach. C. Team pictures will be taken before each team's first match. The souvenir team pictures can be pickup by the team on Sunday of the Tournament. D. Referees will receive their souvenir coin and an appreciation gift to be determined.
<b>19) CONDUCT</b>	A. Coaches will be expected to set a positive example for the team, and will be held responsible for the actions of their team including spectators. All spectators must remain behind the control line and between the 18-yard lines. Two coaches maximum per team, and they must remain in the marked coaching area (within ten yards either way from midfield). B. Referees will be required to complete a game misconduct report for <u>all</u> misconducts during the game, as well as any incidents of interference by spectators. C. Any coach or spectator ejected must immediately leave the vicinity of the playing field (out of sight and sound) and will be prohibited from attending the next scheduled game. Any player sent off (red carded) must immediately leave the vicinity of the game (under supervision of their parent or Safe Haven-certified adult), and may not return to the field of play during the current game, including for the post-game handshake, and may not be substituted for, and is suspended from participation in the next game. There will be penalty point deductions for all send-offs (see Standings rules). Coach or spectator ejected from a game cannot participate in the next game. D. Any violent conduct red card or ejection will result in that player/coach/spectator being barred from the remainder of the tournament. E. If it is determined that an ineligible player has participated in a game, the team will forfeit all games in which that player participated illegally. Furthermore, if it is determined that the coach knowingly played a player illegally, that coach will be barred from further participation in the tournament. F. It is mandatory to play a scheduled game. If it is determined that a coach willfully fails to have his team participate in a scheduled game, the coach will be dismissed from the tournament and the incident will be reported to the respective Regional Commissioner. G. All conduct problems will be reported to the respective Regional Commissioner. H. All Serious Incidents will be reported to the respective Regional Commissioner as well as Area, Section and AYSO National Office parties.
<b>20) MEDICAL/FIRST AID</b>	A. There will be a first aid station at the main tent where participants may receive ice, etc, for minor injuries. B. There will be a roving EMT to respond to injuries on the field. Field monitors will communicate via radio or cell phones to call the first aid staffer to the field where the first aid is requested. C. If an injury is serious, Tournament Safety Director or Tournament staff will have a mobile phone to call 911 for emergency response. D. Directions to the nearest hospital/urgent care center will be available at the check-in table and the Tournament Web site.

<p><b>21) UNIFORMS/ SAFETY</b></p>	<p>A. All players must wear the approved AYSO uniform only, and all players on the same team must wear matching uniforms (except goalkeeper must wear uniform that distinguishes him/her from the other players, the referee and the assistant referees).</p> <p>B. Each player's uniform must be marked with a permanently-affixed unique number that matches the uniform number on the Game Card, and may not exchange numbered jerseys with any other player during the game including the goalkeeper.</p> <p>C. Garments may be worn under the uniform (i.e. long sleeves, etc.) during inclement weather, however the match referee will be the judge of what should be allowed or not.</p> <p>D. Not allowed: jewelry, hard metal or plastic clips on clothing or hair. No player will be allowed to participate with any type of cast or splint. Removal of any type of cast or splint at the field or surrounding area in order to participate shall disqualify that team member from participation.</p> <p>E. AYSO will not prohibit the use of knee braces by players in AYSO events and programs; providing that the brace is adequately covered and padded in the judgment of the referee, so as to eliminate the possibility of its causing injury to the other players on the field.</p>
<p><b>22) PROTESTS</b></p>	<p>A. Protests will be considered only for the following reasons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• An ineligible player has played.</li> <li>• One or more registered player(s), present and in uniform, has not played the required one half of the game (except for illness or injury as recorded by the game referee).</li> </ul> <p>B. All protests must be presented in writing to the Tournament Director within 1/2 hour of the completion of the game.</p> <p>C. All protests will be heard by a Protest Committee of at least three persons selected by the Tournament Director. In all cases, the members of the Protest Committee will be unrelated to either team involved in the protest. ALL PROTEST DECISIONS ARE FINAL.</p> <p>D. Referee judgment calls are FINAL and are not grounds for or subject to protest or dispute.</p>
<p><b>23) RULES INTERPRETATION</b></p>	<p>The Tournament Director or designee retains the right to interpret and apply the tournament rules to the optimum benefit of all tournament participants.</p>
